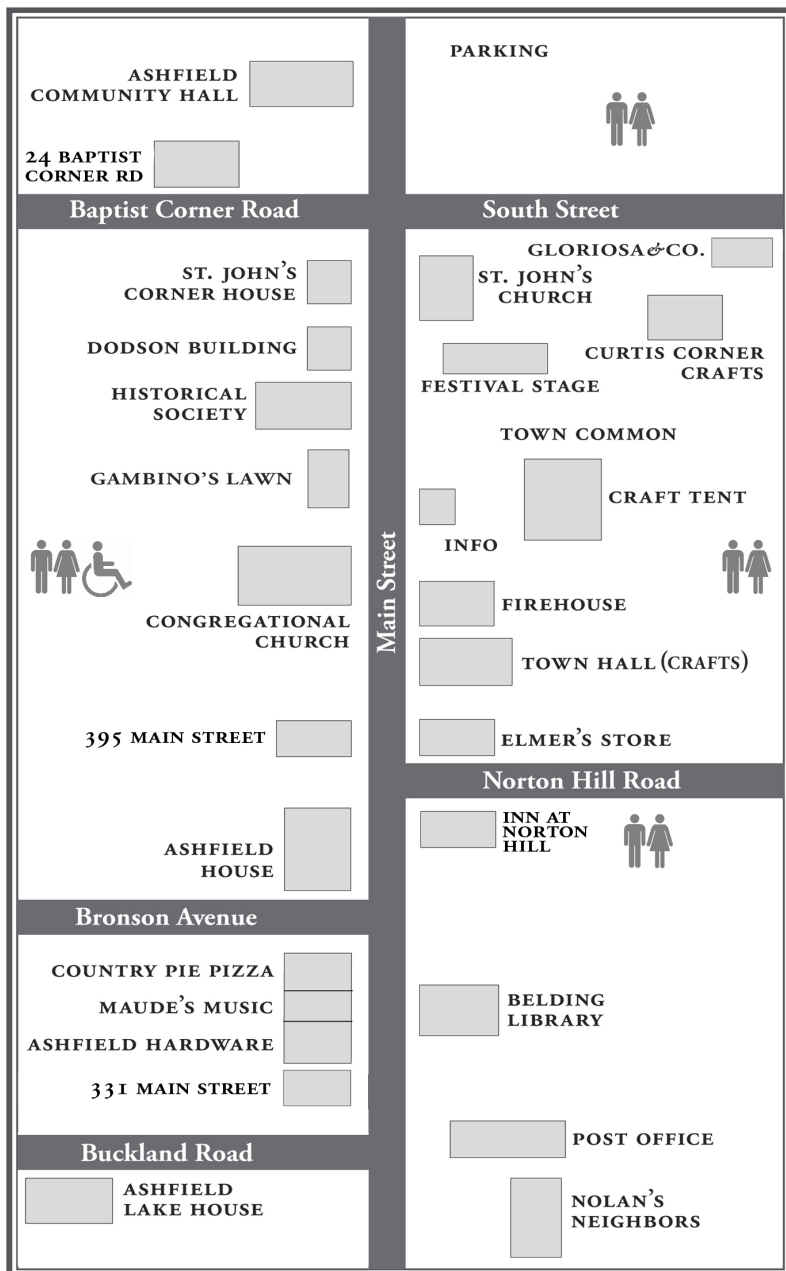




Saturday, October 8 and Sunday, October 9 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.
